WALK TO EMMAUS

In worship on the Sundays after Easter, we thought together about the resurrection appearances of Jesus. Easter is celebrated on a particular day of the year, but the power of the resurrection and the presence of our Risen Lord make a difference every day of the year!

Luke's account of the resurrected Christ walking with two men on the road to Emmaus on that first Easter evening (Luke 24:13-35) brings the power of Christ's presence to light in a wonderful way. Late in the day on that first Easter, two followers of Jesus were traveling from Jerusalem to Emmaus, a village about seven miles away. As they walked, they talked with amazement and consternation about Jesus' crucifixion and the claims of his resurrection that were circulating around Jerusalem. Along the way, a man joined them in the journey. Although they did not recognize him, he listened intently to their story. They expressed their dashed hopes because they had been convinced that this Jesus of Nazareth was the Messiah come to redeem Israel. It was then that the stranger entered the conversation. He explained how all they had been describing had been foretold by the prophets and recorded in the Scriptures. Their hearts burned with excitement as the stranger opened new spiritual realities and new insights to them.

It was almost evening as they neared Emmaus, and the two travelers invited Jesus to stay with them. As they sat down for the evening meal, Jesus took the bread, blessed and broke it, then gave it to them. It was then that they recognized him: Jesus! Alive and present! Imagine coming into personal touch with Jesus the Risen Lord! Imagine experiencing the joy and energy of his resurrected life!

That was the Walk to Emmaus then. The wonderful truth is that Jesus is alive today and ready to walk with us, revealing himself and the power of his resurrected life, just as he did on that first Easter evening. It's not an accident that a wonderful spiritual retreat available to each of us is called the **Emmaus Walk**. The Emmaus Walk is a three day retreat, Thursday evening through Sunday evening, designed to offer a short course in the Christian faith. An Emmaus Walk is about spiritual growth, fun and fellowship, worship, music, new friends, laughter, and sometimes, tears. There are even a couple of surprises along the way, wonderful surprises, the kind of surprise that wouldn't be nearly as wonderful if you knew in advance.

Through fifteen short talks about various aspects of living a vital Christian faith, as well as through the power of Christian community, many Emmaus participants have experienced the presence and power of Jesus, our living Lord, in profound and new ways.

Who is an Emmaus Walk for? It is for those searching for a deeper walk with Jesus. It's for those who have been followers of Jesus but would love a time of spiritual refreshment. It is for those who may not be sure about the Christian faith but want to investigate.

Eleven years ago I was a "pilgrim" on an Emmaus Walk at Hyde Park Community UMC in Cincinnati. I was moving to a new church and at that church, one of my responsibilities would be the Spiritual Director of the Emmaus community there. You can't be a Spiritual Director of an Emmaus Community without attending an Emmaus Walk! It was a wonderful weekend of

spiritual refreshment, encouragement, challenge and joyful renewal. Since then, I have been privileged to participate as a speaker or Spiritual Director for a number of Walks.
